Programs and Services

Port Jobs strengthens our communities by introducing pathways to meaningful employment and career advancement opportunities at Seattle-Tacoma International Airport (SEA). We serve talented and diverse community members with job placement, career navigation, education and career advancement services, and help airport employers find great workers.

Airport Jobs

Airport Jobs connects community members to the broad array of aviation-related job opportunities at SEA Airport. Port Jobs helps more than 80 airport companies hire the workforce they need to keep SEA flying! Our job seeker services include a "Hotlist" of job openings at SEA Airport, job search assistance, career navigation, resume preparation and hiring events. Our average airport job placement wage was \$20.03 per hour in 2023. Port Jobs is a Basic Food Employment and Training (BFET) provider, offering additional job search assistance, resources, and hygiene packs with \$200 worth of products to Basic Food recipients looking for work at SEA.

Airport University

Airport University provides career exploration, education and career-connected learning for career advancement. Through partnerships with Highline and South Seattle Colleges, we offer free college classes to SEA airport workers. Our classes help SEA Airport employees and community members build skills in computers, customer service, communications and math. Our career exploration and pathways programs are a launch pad to careers in aviation maintenance technology, air cargo/logistics, pilot training and homeland security.

Programs and Services

Alaska Airlines - Airport University Scholarships

Through Port Jobs, Alaska Airlines generously funds an Airport University scholarship program to help SEA Airport employees continue their college education and advance in careers. All airport employees are eligible to apply and can use awards to study aviation maintenance technology, pilot training, aeronautical science, air cargo logistics/supply chain management, airline dispatch and air traffic control.

Aviation Career Exploration Workshops

Port Jobs hosts Aviation Career Exploration Workshops in partnership with area colleges and airport companies. These workshops are fantastic entry points for airport employees and community members, including taxi/ride share drivers, to discover how to launch a new aviation career. Workshops include aviation maintenance technology, logistics, pilots, and aviation electronics. Future workshops will add ground service equipment mechanic, air traffic control and airline dispatch.




388 participant packages were provided to **215** Basic Food, Employment & Training Services (BFET) clients, each with basic hygiene and health products valued at \$200+.

Partner Spotlight: Serve Ethiopians Washington

The Airport University Aviation Maintenance Technology (AMT) program is an aircraft mechanic career pathway program made possible through a partnership between the Port of Seattle, Port Jobs, and South Seattle College. In fall 2023, we offered the fifth "Introduction to AMT" on-ramp class at SEA Airport. Students who complete this class bridge into the two-year, FAA-approved AMT program at South Seattle College and receive a \$1,000 scholarship from Port Jobs' Alaska Airlines-Airport University Scholarship program.

In 2023, Port Jobs worked for the first time with Serve Ethiopians Washington (SEW), who won a South King County grant from the Port of Seattle, in a new partnership focused on AMT program recruitment and success. The grant project included special outreach to SEA taxi and rideshare drivers in addition to other SEA airport workers. Armaye Eshete, SEW Executive Director said, "We look forward to this partnership with Port Jobs. SEW and Port Jobs will work in tandem to reach out to SEA taxi and rideshare drivers to promote the AMT class and help potential students understand the AMT pathway, and the prerequisites for enrolling, as well as the benefits of this supported pathway to high demand living wage jobs."

Armaye added, "Workforce development is a priority of the community we serve. Through our New Start Workforce Development Program, SEW aims to create a pathway for immigrant and BIPOC refugee drivers to obtain careers in the aviation industry."

The partnership has been a success. Twenty airport workers completed the fall 2023 class, fifteen of whom are starting the AMT program at South Seattle College in spring 2024, including seven SEA taxi/ride-share drivers. Heather Worthley, Port Jobs Executive Director said, "We hope to connect with more SEA Airport community members through this partnership. We have already benefitted from this new relationship with SEW, whose staff brings vital lived experience and language access skills, along with passion to this work."
