The types of programs include Early Childhood Education Assistance Program (ECEAP) (3 or 4 year olds by August 31 st ; Head Start (HS) – 3 or 4 year olds by August 31 st ; Early Head Start (EHS) (six weeks old to 36 months old); and Early Head Start (EHSB) home-based (Pregnant Families and newborns to 36 months old) and Family Child Care (FCC).
Seattle Department of Education and Early Learning (DEEL) Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP)	https://education.seattle.gov/seattle-families-invited-to-apply-to-child-care-assistance-program/	The City of Seattle’s Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP) helps families cover childcare costs for children one month to 12 years old. To be eligible families must live within the City of Seattle limit; have an income below 94% of the State Median Income (SMI) and demonstrate ineligibility for other childcare subsidy programs. To see if you are living in City of Seattle limits utilize Find Your District and Councilmembers - Council seattle.gov .
